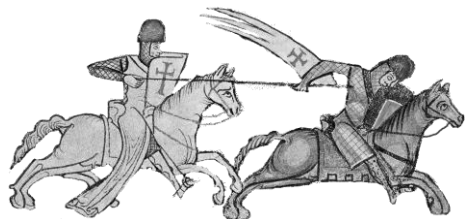

Rabei Khamisy is an archaeologist and historian. He is currently director of the Montfort Castle Project, and director of the archaeological excavations, preservation and development in Mi'ilya. A lecturer in the Department of Archaeology and a member of the Zinman Institute of Archaeology at the University of Haifa, Rabei's research deals with several fields in crusader archaeology and history, and Ayyubid/Mamluk documentation. In addition, he is currently working on the Ottoman period history and anthropology in rural settlements in northern Israel. His current field work includes major excavations in crusader sites, including Montfort castle, Castellum Regis and the crusader village of Khirbat al-Manhata. His most recent publications include "Baybars' strategy of war against the Franks." In *Journal of Medieval Military History*: Volume 16 (2018), and the forthcoming "Fortifications and Mangonel Operation in Thirteenth-Century Ayyubid Cities: Damietta as a Case Study" in *Crusades*, Vol. 19 (2021). Dr. Khamisy also co-edited *Montfort: History, Early Research and Recent Studies of the Principal Fortress of the Teutonic Order* with Adrian Boas, which won the 2017 Verbruggen prize.
